Saturday, May 4th will be a busy day. We start the morning with a Community Education class on bowl turning. We'll need mentors. I think that set up is at 8:30 am but will let Michelle confirm the schedule.

I have on the 2024 Agenda that we're grilling hot dogs at noon but have done little to organize that. I apologize. We'll need a grill, hot dogs, side dishes and desserts. Please let me know if we can still get that done. Note from Rex – if you can help with this contact Aaron. I believe the hot dogs have been provided (Thanks Jon).

Jack Zimmel will be doing a demonstration with his Rose Engine. I really can't do that machine justice in words. All I can say is that anyone loving detail, precision and complexity needs to see this demonstration.

We started April donating 56 stands to Avera Hospital. The Hospital in Sioux Falls donated six to patients the first week. Others were shipped to Avera's facilities throughout the State. The response has been humbling. In gratitude, Avera is providing us a table at the Annual Cancer Race on May 11th. We will need additional stands to place on that table. Please bring finished stands to our next meeting.

We are also in the midst of our Spring Community Education classes. Michelle has done an exceptional job coordinating the moving parts as our Education Chair. The students' positive responses are attributable to our exceptional teachers Doug, Royce and Alistair and all of our mentors.

Lastly, members* met at Doug's shop on April 20th to build lathe stands. Five of our lathes had been stored on the floor of our trailer. These lathes were previously moved on a dolly and

hoisted upon tables for classes. These lathes are now attached to stands with casters. Each lathe's tool box can be stored in the stand. The stands all fit in the trailer. We are in the process of getting a stencil to paint our name and website on the stands.

Our next business meeting is May 4th at 1:00 p.m. My hope is that we we'll see a lot of faces from our Community Education Classes. Around 2:00 p.m., Jack Zimmel will demonstrate his Rose Engine. Meeting called to order at 1:00 PM by President Aaron Salberg. 33 Members and guests were present and introduced themselves. A quorum was determined and reported by the secretary.

It was moved, seconded and passed by voice vote to accept the minutes from the March meeting. A review of the Treasurer's report was presented by Royce for Mike Dimock, treasurer, who was unable to attend the meeting. An ending balance of \$2084.42 was reported. It was moved and seconded that the Treasurer's Report be accepted. The motion was passed by voice vote.

Committee Reports

Membership

Community Ed

Equipment – Bill reported that the two new (2023) lathes are pink and the 2024 lathes are brown for toolboxes. He has conducted an inventory of tools in all toolboxes and there is always a need for tools for the boxes. If you have tools to donate please contact Bill. There are brass filings available from Bill as well. There is a new toolbox for the big Jet. \$400.00 has been authorized for tool purchase and \$180.00 has been spent.

New Business

Motion made and seconded for adjournment at 2:10 PM, passed by voice vote.
